The Minnesota experiment' station says barley has the advantage over flax for cleaning the land of weeds, besides being often fed on the farm at a profit over the market price. At present prices, however, flax is in the lead, and good flax land will undoubtedly return a good profit.

After the young turkeys are sixteen to twenty days old begin to feed lightly on cracked corn, wheat, etc., and occasionally baked cornmeal or johnnycake, which is simply cornmeal mixed with either sweet skimmilk or water and a very little salt, and thoroughly baked. This is moistened slightly before feeding.


