

CONDENSED NEWS

Fireman John Moran was killed in a \$100,000 blaze in the Decker piano factory at Chicago.

Notwithstanding the rumors current of a threatening massacre of Jews, perfect quiet reigns in Kiev, Russia.

The Western Federation of Miners has been granted full affiliation with the American Federation of Labor.

Oklahoma's bank deposit guaranty system will be tested in the courts on the plea that its assessments are confiscatory.

The value of wealth produced on farms of the United States was \$8,325,000,000 in 1910, an increase of \$104,000,000 over 1909.

A shortage of \$25,000 in the accounts of H. Beette, teller of the People's Savings bank of Woonsocket, R. I., was reported.

John Dietz, defender of Cameron dam, convicted of first degree murder, was given a life sentence. His wife and son were acquitted.

Two barges laden with Belgian soldiers capsized during a storm on the Laalaba river, near Lokandu, Belgian Congo. Thirty lives were lost.

Nowhere in the country is the law against Sunday liquor selling being enforced so thoroughly as in New York, according to Mayor Gaynor.

New York brokers appealed to the United States supreme court to hurry up the Standard Oil and tobacco case decisions, saying the wait hurts business.

Exports from the United States for the first time in any twelve-month period passed the \$2,000,000,000 mark, being \$2,012,749,595 for the year ending with April.

The sinking of the Ward liner Merida by the steamer Admiral Farragut will cause a loss of \$2,000,000, according to an estimate made by the owning company.

President Taft's friends in Washington have discarded Vice President Sherman for running mate and talk of Cummins, Deneen or Hadley for second place in 1912.

Dr. Jose Madriz, the man placed in the presidency of Nicaragua by Zelaya as his successor when he was forced to flee, died in Mexico City from Bright's disease.

Lady Decies, who before her marriage to Lord Decies, was Miss Helen Vivien Gould, underwent an operation for appendicitis in London. The result was most satisfactory.

Graham Gilmour and Oscar Morrison engaged in an aeroplane race from Shoreham to Roodcan, England, ten miles. Gilmour won by three hundred yards. A great crowd witnessed the flight.

While going after a patient, the city hospital ambulance was struck by a College avenue street car at Indianapolis, killing Dr. Andrew G. Cooper, an interne, and seriously injuring Miss Gladys Freeland, a nurse.

William Carroll, sixty-five years of age, was sentenced by Justice Britton to be hanged on July 26. Carroll's crime was the murder of William Theiland last November in a lumber camp near Blind River, Mich.

Indictments were returned against eighteen well known citizens of McLean county, Kentucky, growing out of the spectacular lynching of the negro, William Potter, in the opera house at Livermore last month.

Senator Kenyon is getting a large number of requisitions for copies of a bill he has introduced for the amendment to the Sherman law. Interest in this measure, which would make the law more stringent, is shown in many quarters.

The American Bible society is celebrating the conclusion of its ninety-sixth year by announcing the completion of a \$500,000 subscription fund, which will enable it to take advantage of the conditional gift of Mrs. Russell Sage for another \$500,000.

Secretary of War Jacob Dickinson of Tennessee, the Democratic member of the president's cabinet, has resigned. Henry L. Stimson of New York, recently defeated Republican candidate for governor of that state, has been given the portfolio.

Three centuries of civilization have not brought the full blood Indian to the point where his rights are equal to those of the white man. Such was the decision of the supreme court of the United States in holding constitutional the twenty-five year restrictions on the sale of Indian lands.

That Boston is the hardest city in the country for negroes to find respectable neighborhoods in which to live and that the hospitals of that city discriminate against the negro are contentions of the Boston branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

Six negro soldiers from the Sixth regiment, Massachusetts national guard, bore into the ancient First Parish church of Cambridge the body of Colonel Thomas Wentworth Higginson, whose funeral was attended by a great throng representing the civic and literary life of Cambridge and Boston. During the civil war Colonel Higginson commanded a regiment of negro soldiers.

Lid Goes On at Platte, S. D.
 Sioux Falls, S. D., May 15.—The recent arrest at Platte of two professional gamblers on the charge that they had fleeced a Platte man out of \$113 in a poker game has terminated in the "lid" being placed tightly on gambling and all other games of chance at that place.
