From Columbus Telegram:

That is the score in the judicial game in Nebraska—seven republican political judges on the bench and no democrats, and few jurists.

It is a one-sided game, often full of horse play—always full of politics.

It has been well said that the people of a state get just the kind of government they want. That is true, except in those instances where the courts overturn the will of the people. Is it the will of the people of Nebraska that the highest court in the state shall forever remain a political court?

In November the people will have opportunity to say whether or not they approve the plan to keep that high court always safely within control of the republican machine in Nebraska. In many quarters The Telegram hears the hope and the belief expressed that the masses of republican voters in Nebraska will this year have the courage to repudiate the action of the judicial mafia which procured the nomination of the three republican candidates for supreme judge at the late primary. These men say that the high political court had, and used the power to retain its membership in office a few years by killing the non-partisan court law which was passed by the legislature, but they believe that when the people get a chance to render a verdict at the November election they will reverse the decision of the court by electing a few democrats to sit with the republican majority.

Seven to nothing is now the score. It will be different in November.
