## A MODEL HOME-GROWN DINNER

A Grand Spread at Eastgate Brothers' North Dakota Farm

We have a copy of the Grand Forks "North Dakota Herald" of October 27, in which is an account of a dinner given by Eastgate Brothers at their Willowbank farm, four miles northwest of Larimore in North Dakota. We mention this because the Eastgate brothers, Harry, Jacob and Charles, were sons of Mrs. E. C. Eastgate and brothers of Mrs. Dr. Churchill, and also because it may be an object lesson for our Nebraska readers many of whom can, we believe, if they will, do as well in raising on their own farms the things necessary for their tables ordinarily, and for a feast, as occasion may demand. Above is the menu served by the Eastgate Brothers and their wives, to a number of invited guests and it certainly is a menu fit for a king or anybody else. Everything served, with the exception of the tea, coffee and sweets, was produced and prepared right on the farm. The invited guests included some of the state officials. Willowbank farm, as it is called, was the homestead of the Eastgate Brothers' parents, and has been owned by the Eastgate family for over thirty years.

The Herald would like to see Nebraska farmers, especially those in the western part of the state, try their hand at raising things necessary for their tables as above stated and also furnish us as a matter of news an account of dinners or parties similar to the one mentioned above.

### OMAHA SHEEP SHOW

The Omaha sheep show will be held in connection with the annual convention of the National Wool Growers, which will be held in Omaha, Dec. 14-16, the sheep show opening one day earlier.
