



New Zealand voted on the question of national prohibition on Dec. 11, and the result of the referendum vote was 55.93 percent of the total vote cast for prohibition, while only 60 percent is required to make it a

Public sentiment in favor of a pronibition law has been growing rapidly, and it is confidentially believed that in 1914, when the next referendum on this question will be taken, it will pass. If this should be the outcome, it is said that the nearest saloon to New Zealand will be 1200 miles away. The complete returns show that 255,864 persons voted in favor of the measure, while 202,608 voted against it.

Prof. R. L. Searson, formerly of the Peru Normal school, but now of the State Agriculture College Manhattan, Kansas, spoke before the recent meeting of the State Educational Association of New Mexico at Santa Fe. In his lecture he declared that the prohibition law was the best enforced law in Kansas. further stated that it was far better enforced than the local option law in Nebraska.

At the close of the meeting the association, in a strong resolution, declared for state-wide prohibition for New Mexico.

Evidence of prosperity in anti-saloon territory is plentiful. The latest is furnished by the Superintendents and Foremens Association of the Selby Shoe Company of Portsmouth, Ohio, in a resolution have adopted explaining why they unanimously opposed the return of the saloons to their county.
