Superintendent Martin was detained at his home in Nebraska City so that he could not bepresent at the opening on Monday, but arrived yesterday morning.





CURTIS BIPLANE AS IT WILL APPEAR IN FLIGHT AT THE STOCKMEN'S CONVENTION




