MILLION DOLLARS

PAID FOR BEET CROP

Farmers in North Platte Valley Realize Big Returns on Yield of Sugar Vegetable

More than one million dollars will be paid this year for sugar beets to the farmers who raised them in the North Platte valley between Bridgeport, Nebr., and Lingle, Wyo., according to F. A. Wright of Scottsbiuff. Mr. Wright, who was in Lin coln on Monday, declared that this has been a very prosperous seasaon in that part of the state.

"The average beet crop is estimated at fifteen tons to the acre, and the farmers will get \$5.50 per ten for them, delivered at the shipsaid. "This means a return of \$82.50 an acre for the beets. will bring about \$3 an acre more for cattle feed. About 17,000 acres was planted for 1912.

"The sugar factory at Scottsbluff will pay out \$250,000 for operating expenses alone, besides the money which goes to the farmers for their crop. The factory is using 1,400 tons of beets per day and the campaign, which started on September

Mr. Wright is an enthusiastic booster for his section and city. He says the alfalfa crop raised in the North Platte valley will nearly all be fed to live stock there this year so that little will be shipped. Beet pulp is also used for feeding cattle and sheep. Last year 135,000 sheep were fed. This year the numbre will be considerably more.-Lincoln
