EXPLANATION

This following statement contains a list of the school district officers and teachers of Box Butte county for 1912-13, the number of months school is held in each district, school census for 1912 showing the number of children of school age, total assessed valuation, and the school tax levy. In order to condense the statement as much as possible some words are not repeated for each district, but the statement will be easily understood by remembering that after the school district number the following order, except in the Alliance district, No. 6, where the board of education consists of five members:
