\$10,000 GIFT TO NEBRASKA

Several more specialists on different agricultural subjects will be added, temporarily at least, to the Agri-Mrs. C. C. Pflug of Hyannis came cultural Extension Service of the Neceive \$5,000 next July 1 and an additional \$5,000 next January 1. Additional contributions will be granted if the Nebraska legislature will appropriate an equal amount. The money is to be used for persons not having an opportunity to study agriculture in the schools and colleges. None of the money may be used for the purchase or the upkeep of agricultural school buildings. If the Nebraska legislature makes it possible for the additional federal contributions to be received, a much more generous amount of agricultural information may be sent directly to the people than is offered at pres-
