The Board of County Commissioners met, as a Board of Equalization, Tuesday June 9th, 1914, according to law; members present, C. L. Hashman, chairman, S. C. Reck, J. M. Wanek, John Jelinek, county assessor, and M. S. Hargraves, clerk.

Emma Bliss Gilbert appeared before the board and complained of valuation placed on Lot 3, Block 7, Hills Addition to Alliance, Nebraska, and after comparing value placed on same with values placed on like properties in same location, it was ordered that the valuation of said Lot 3, Block 7, be changed from \$600.00 to \$500.00.

The balance of the day was spent by the board in adjusting values of property, which were changed on account of improvements being added, or removed.

Ordinance No. 196

An Ordinance Changing the License Occupation Tax upon Moving Picture Shows and upon Moving Picture Shows in Combination with Vaudeville Performances, Repealing Ordinance No. 185 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, and amending Section 2 of Ordinance No. 135 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, NEBRASKA.

Section 1. That ordinance No. 185 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, entitled "An ordinance amending Section 2 of Ordinance No. 135 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Alliance, Entitled, 'An ordinance providing for the levy and collection of a license occupation tax upon certain occupations and business carried on in the City of Alliance, Nebraska, regulating the same and providing penalties for the violation of the same and repealing ordinance No. 43 entitled, 'An ordinance to provide for the levying and collection of a license occupation tax upon certain occupations and business as carried on in the City of Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, regulating the same and providing penalty for violation,' as amended by ordinance No. 54 and ordinance No. 105 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska," and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 2. That Section 2 of ordinance No. 135 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, entitled "An ordinance providing for the levy and collection of a license occupation tax upon certain occupations and business carried on in the City of Alliance, Nebraska, regulating the same and providing penalties for the violation of the same, and repealing ordinance of a license occupation tax upon certain occupations and business car-

ried on in the City of Alliance, Box Alliance No. 43, entitled 'An ordinance to provide for the levying and collection of a license occupation tax upon certain occupations and business carried on in the City of Alliance, Nebraska, regulating the same and providing penalty for violation,' as amended by Ordinance No. 54 and Ordinance No. 105 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska" be amended to read as follows:

Amusements. For circus or circus and menagerie combined, the license fee shall be \$50.00 per day; for each show connected with any circus the license fee shall be \$25.00 per day; for all other shows or exhibitions in tents, the license fee shall be \$10.00 per day; for performances and tricks of legerdemain, rope walking, tumbling or physical exhibitions, the license fee shall be \$2.00 per day; for merry-go-rounds, steam or otherwise, and for all other and like performances or exhibitions, the license fee shall be \$5.00 per day; for moving picture shows the license fee shall be \$50.00 per year; for moving picture shows in combination with vaudeville performances, the license fee shall be \$50.00 per year. Yearly licenses shall be for the current fiscal year and shall end on the first Tuesday in May, following their issue, but if said licenses are issued subsequent to the beginning of the municipal year, the fee therefor shall be assessed in proportion to the number of weeks between the issuance of the license and the expiration of the current fiscal year.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

Ordinance No. 197

An Ordinance Establishing a Curb Line on all Streets in the City of Alliance, Nebraska, and Repealing Ordinance No. 144 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, NEBRASKA.

Section 1. That the curb line on either side of all streets in said city shall be at a distance of one-fourth the width of such street from the center thereof, excepting Box Butte Avenue and Third Street where it shall be thirty-six feet from the center of the street.

Section 2. That Ordinance No. 144 of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, entitled, "An Ordinance Establishing a Uniform Curb Line for the Streets in the City of Alliance, Nebraska, and to repeal Ordinance No. 30, entitled: 'An Ordinance Establishing Curb Lines in all Portions of the City of Alliance,'" and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.
