The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebruska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebruska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 3rd, A. D. 1914.

"FOR a Joint resolution to amend section 1 of Article 9 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to revenue. Be it Resolved and Emacted by the People of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Article 9 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Article 9 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1. The rules of taxation shall be uniform as to any given class and taxes shall be levied upon such property as the Legislature shall prescribe. Taxes may also be imposed on incomes, privileges and occupations, which taxes may be graduated and progressive and reasonable exemptions may be provided, in addition to those hereinafter specifically mentioned in section 2 of this article.

Sec. 2. That at the general election in November, 1914, there shall be submitted to the electors of the state for their approval or rejection the foregoing proposed amendment to the Constitution providing form: "For amendment to the Constitution providing for uniform and progressive taxation" and "against said proposed amendment to the Constitution providing for uniform and progressive taxation" and "occupant providing for uniform and progressive taxation" and progressive taxation."
