## POTATO CROP FAIRLY GOOD

Late Rains and Favorable Weather Bring Out Spuds Much Better than Expected

Five weeks ago it looked like the potato crop in Box Butte county would be almost a minus quantity, but late rains and favorable weather have brought out the spuds in a way to surprise and delight the natives. Fred Abley, whose farm is northwest of Alliance, seven or eight miles from Hemingford, informed The Herald last Friday that about five weeks prior to that time he and his son investigated their field of potatoes, examining about a hundred hills, and decided that the crop would be a total failure. Much to their surprise the tubers set on and have made a fine growth so that now there is good prospect of a yield averaging at least fifty bushels per acre, which with the present price beats nothing a whole lot.

On the same day Mrs. John Lawrence, Sr., from Fairview, ten miles northeast of Alliance, was in town and stated that potatoes in that neighborhood will make a nice crop, altho it was not expected a few weeks ago. Other reports agree that, while the crop this year may not be as heavy as last year, it will be a good many thousand bushels better than nothing.
