ELECTION FACTS FOR ALL VOTERS

Secretary of State Addison Wait furnishes Facts which Every Voter Should Know About

Addison Wait, secretary of state, has furnished The Herald with the following information regarding the fall election:

To be held Tuesday, November 3. Polls open at 8 o'clock, a. m., and close at 6 o'clock, p. m. All voters residing in Omaha and Lincoln must register this year. Registration days, Tuesday October 6 and Saturday October 24. Polls open 8 o'clock a. m., close 9 o'clock p. m. In cities of 7500 to 25000 voters who have changed residence since last election should register with City Clerk. No fee charged for registration. A voter must have resided six months in the state, forty days in the county and ten days in the precinct, township or ward. There will be four ballots this year, viz: General Election ballot, non-partisan judiciary, University Location and voting by mail. Four New Propositions under the Initiative and Referendum are to be voted on, viz: Workmen's Compensation and Employer's Liability Act, Memorial Army at Nebraska City, Equal Suffrage for Women and University Location. Every elector should vote on all these propositions in order to definitely settle them. It requires 35 percent of the total vote in favor of these propositions to carry them. Go to the polls early as the ballot is lengthy and requires time and study while in the voting booth.

POSTOFFICE SAFE BLOWN AT MULLEN

Safelowers entered the rear of the postoffice building at Mullen last Thursday night, October 1, blew the postoffice safe and secured cash, stamps and money orders worth several hundred dollars. Two men, who were seen near the town on Thursday, are believed to have committed the deed. The rear window had been barred. The bars were twisted off.

The work is believed to have been done by expert safelowers, from the appearance of the room and the damaged safe. Blankets had been used to deaden the sound of the explosion and no one in the town knew of it until early morning. Tracks of horses were found nearby and followed in the sand for some distance, but finally lost. Postoffice department detectives are working on the case.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. ONE
The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 3rd, A. D. 1914.

"FOR A Joint resolution to amend section 1 of Article 9 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to revenue. Be It Resolved and Enacted by the People of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Article 9 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1. The rules of taxation shall be uniform as to any given class and taxes shall be levied upon such property as the Legislature shall prescribe. Taxes may also be imposed on incomes, privileges and occupations, which taxes may be graduated and progressive and reasonable exemptions may be provided, in addition to those hereinafter specifically mentioned in Section 2 of this article.

Sec. 2. That at the general election in November, 1914, there shall be submitted to the electors of the state for their approval or rejection the foregoing proposed amendment to the Constitution in the following form: "For amendment to the Constitution providing for uniform and progressive taxation against said proposed amendment to the Constitution providing for uniform and progressive taxation."
