The fire also burned through the wall into the Haldeman laboratory, thus causing the second fire. The damage in the Haldeman place, while not so serious as in Bartley's, is bad enough. The laboratory is ruined, together with a typewriter and other equipment. The damage from water, smoke and heat is also manifest in all the rooms.
