Chadron, Nebr., May 26—All normal school commencement exercises are free. Normal school chapel seats 400. Reservations may be

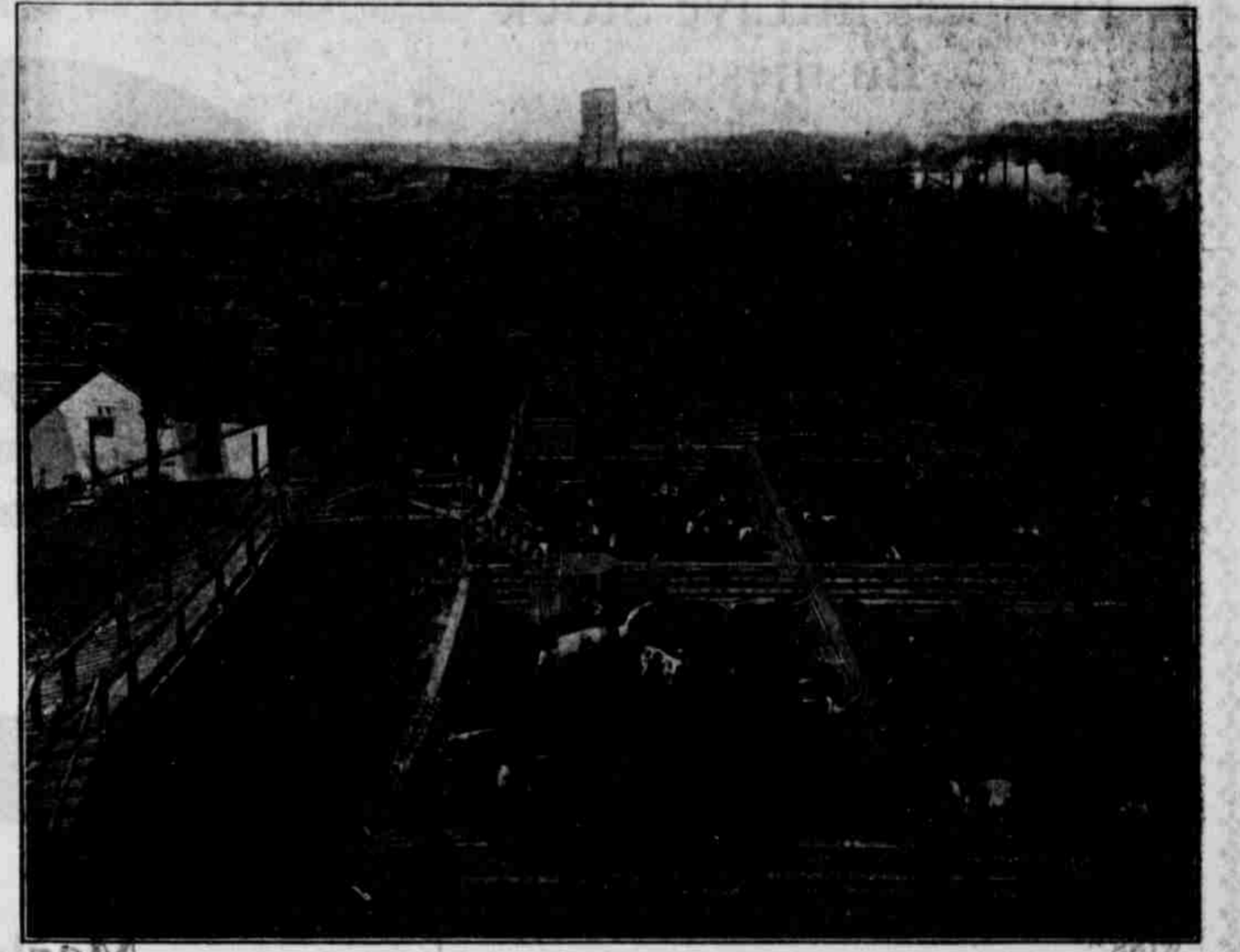
nesday a return game was played here.
