ORDINANCE NO. 214

An ordinance to provide for the taspection of milk and cream sold with in the city of Alliance, and of dairies and dairy herds kept for the production of such milk, and to prevent fraud in the sale of milk, and pre-serve the public health, and to license and regulate the sale and disposition of milk in said city.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAY OR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE:

Section 1. That from and after the passage, approval and publication of this Ordinance no person, persons, firm or corporation shall sell or offer for sale any milk or cream within the City of Alliance without first having obtained a license so to do in the manner hereinafter provided.

Section 2. That no license shall be issued for a period beyond the first day of May, 1916, and all li-May, yearly, thereafter.

Before the issuance of a license, every vender of milk or cream shall pay to the city treasurer the license fee herein imposed and shall take a receipt for the same, which said receipt shall be presented to the city clerk, whose duty it shall be to keep a record as follows:

First. The name and residence of the applicant, or if a firm, name and residence of each of said firm, or if a corporation, name and residence of the person in charge of each, and the name of the president and secretary of said corporation.

Second. The location of the business place or places of the applicant, giving street and number, and the charge of each.
