**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION**

of the Odd Fellows Building Association of Alliance  
KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, A. D. Rodgers, Lloyd C. Thomas, John Snyder, T. M. Lawler, C. W. Jeffers, H. H. Brandt and W. B. Young, citizens of the United States, and residing in the State of Nebraska, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purposes of forming and becoming a corporation in the State of Nebraska, for the purposes of the transacting of the business hereinafter described.

**Article I**  
The name of this corporation shall be the ODD FELLOWS BUILDING ASSOCIATION OF ALLIANCE.

**Article II**  
The principal place of transacting its business shall be at Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, where meetings of incorporators, stockholders and directors shall be held and all business transacted.

**Article III**  
The purposes for which said corporation is to be formed are as follows:

(a) To provide and own a home for the Odd Fellows lodges, including the subordinate, Rebekah, Encampment and Canton, of Alliance, Nebraska, and for such other lodges as may be desired.

(b) To take, lease, purchase, hire or otherwise acquire and to hold, use, sell, lease, exchange, mortgage, improve and develop real estate, real property and any interest or right therein, and to construct or have constructed such houses and buildings as is necessary, and to buy, sell, own, use, manage, operate and lease the same or similar structures.

(c) To borrow money, with or without security, and for the repayment of the same, to give the obligations of this corporation with any necessary or required security, and to lend money, with or without security, and to do anything whatsoever necessary, useful, desirable, convenient, or auxiliary to any of the purposes of this corporation.

**Article IV**  
(a) The authorized capital stock of this corporation shall be Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), divided into one thousand (1,000) shares of the par value of ten dollars (\$10.00) each.

(b) The amount of capital stock with which said corporation will begin business is one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00).

(c) At such time as the Board of Directors may by resolution direct, said capital stock shall be paid into this corporation, either in cash or by the sale and transfer to it of real or personal property, contracts, services, or any other valuable right or thing for the use and purposes of said corporation, in payment for which shares of the capital stock of said corporation may be issued and the capital stock so issued shall thereupon and thereby become and be fully paid up the same as though paid for in cash at par, and shall be non-assessable forever, and the judgment of the directors as to the value of any property, right or thing acquired in exchange for capital stock shall be conclusive.

**Article V**  
The existence of this corporation shall commence on the twenty-first day of December, 1915, and continue for a period of fifty (50) years thereafter, unless sooner dissolved by a vote of two-thirds of the stock thereof.

**Article VI**  
The highest amount of indebtedness to which said corporation may at any time subject itself shall not exceed two-thirds of the capital stock.

**Article VII**  
The annual meeting of the stockholders of this corporation shall be held on the first Tuesday in January of each year, beginning with the year 1917, at which meeting the Directors of the company shall be elected, and such other lawful business done as the stockholders shall deem necessary and proper.

**Article VIII**  
(a) The officers of said corpora-

tion shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. The officers shall be chosen by the Board of Directors, and shall hold their office for the period of one year and until their successors are elected and qualified. The business of said corporation shall be conducted by a Board of Directors, of whom there shall be seven. At the annual meeting to be held in January, 1917, four directors shall be elected for a term of one year and three for a term of two years. At the annual meetings held thereafter directors shall be elected for terms of two years, the necessary number being elected to fill the expiring terms. Directors shall be elected from among the stockholders.

(b) The Directors until the annual meeting in January, 1917, or until their successors are chosen, shall be A. D. Rodgers, Lloyd C. Thomas, John Snyder, T. M. Lawler, C. W. Jeffers, H. H. Brandt and W. B. Young.

**Article IX**  
These articles of incorporation may be amended at any regular meeting of the stockholders or at any special meeting of the stockholders, called for that purpose, upon due written notice having been given to all stockholders of record.

ORDINANCE NO. 215

An ordinance levying a special assessment against the following described real estate, to-wit: Lots 34, 69, 70, 86, 87, 88, 89 and 91 in County Addition, Lot 7 in block 1, First Addition, Lot 2 in block 4, Lot 7 in block 10, Lot 5 in block 1, Second Addition, Lot 13 in block 3, Second County Addition, 1/2 of Lots 7 and 8, and lot 12 in Block 2, Original Town, lot 6 in Block K, Sheridan addition, all in Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska; and to pay the costs of construction of sidewalks abutting upon and adjacent to said lots and to pay the expenses incidental thereto, and providing for the payment of said assessments and providing the means of collection thereof, and providing a penalty for failure to pay the same.

WHEREAS, on the 11th day of January, 1916, the City Council of Alliance, Nebraska, sat as a Board of Equalization to determine the benefits derived by the lots and real estate described as follows, to-wit: Lots 24, 69, 70, 86, 87, 88, 89 and 91 in County Addition, Lot 7 in Block 1, First Addition, Lot 2 in Block 4, Lot 7 in Block 10, Lot 5 in Block 1, Second Addition, Lot 13 in Block 3, Second County Addition, Lot 6 in Block K, Sheridan Addition, and the 1/2 of Lots 7 and 8, and all of Lot 12 in Block 2, Original Town of Alliance, all within Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, by reason of the construction of sidewalks abutting upon and adjacent to said lots, said meeting having been given due notice as required by law, and whereas, at said meeting it was found that among other things, the special benefits derived by each of said lots above described were uniform and equal in proportion to the total number of front feet abutting said sidewalks constructed and in proportion to the costs of construction of said sidewalks and was benefitted to the extent hereinafter set out, and the record of said Board of Equalization being herein referred to and made a part hereof.

THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance, Nebraska:

**SECTION ONE.** That there is hereby levied a special assessment against said lots above described, which levy assessed against each lot described is as follows:

Lot 34, County Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$88.14.

Lots 69 and 70, County Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$116.25.

Lot 86, County Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$44.48.

Lot 87, County Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$47.65.

Lot 88, County Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$53.10.

Lot 89, County Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$59.35.

Lot 91, County Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$193.24.

Lot 6, Block K, Sheridan Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$87.88.

1/2 Lots 7 and 8, Block 2, Original Town of Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$60.66.

Lot 12, Block 2, Original Town of Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$33.58.

1/2 Lot 5, Block 1, 2nd Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$22.75.

Lot 2, Block 4, 2nd Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$20.29.

Lot 7, Block 10, 2nd Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$85.15.

Lot 13, Block 3, 2nd County Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$30.29.

Lot 7, Block 1, 1st Addition to Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska, \$118.56.

**SECTION TWO.** That one-seventh of the total costs and the above assessments shall become delinquent in ten days after such levy; one-seventh in one year; one-seventh in two years; one-seventh in three years; one-seventh in four years; one-seventh in five years; and one-seventh in six years; that each of such installments except the first shall draw interest at the rate of seven percent per annum from the time of the levy aforesaid until the same shall become delinquent and after the same shall become delinquent, interest at the rate of ten percent per annum shall be paid thereon as in the case of other special taxes, and such special tax shall be enforced and collected as in cases of other general taxes, provided the entire costs of the construction of said sidewalks shall be charged to the real estate benefitted and upon which said sidewalk abuts, and if the owners of said property shall pay the entire amount of said special tax within ten days from the date hereof, such real estate shall be exempt from any lien or charge thereon.

**SECTION THREE.** This Ordinance shall take effect and be enforced from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

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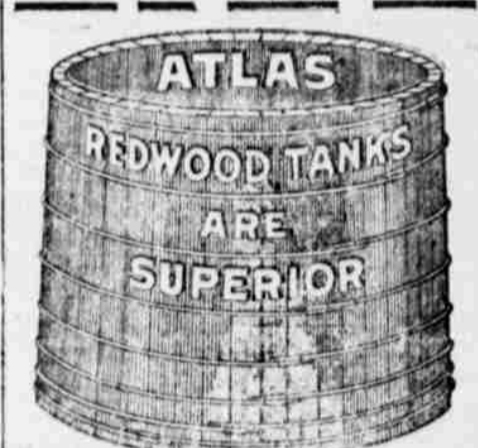
