RAISE BETTER PIGS

Seidel Sending Out Illustrated Posters to All County Schools to Interest Boys in Raising Pigs

"Raise Better Pigs" is the title of an illustrated poster being sent to all the country schools of Box Butte county by County Agent F. M. Seidel. These posters are for the purpose of interesting boys in the pig-raising project of the Nebraska boys' and girls' clubs.

Any boy in the county over ten years old and under eighteen may enroll for the contest. Each boy will feed one or more spring pigs for at least four months beginning at weaning time. His work will be directed and supervised by the Agricultural Extension Service of the State University. When the contest ends, each boy will have to show what his pigs have cost him, how fast they have gained, and how he fed them. Record blanks and reports will be furnished to each boy.

As an example of what was accomplished by some of the boys who tried this work last season, may be mentioned Jonas Johnson of Dawes county. Jonas raised one grade Duroc-Jersey pig which made an average daily gain of 1.5 pounds for 121 days. The average cost of feed for each pound of gain was 3.3 cents. At market price for his pig, Jonas figured that he made a clear profit of \$5.82.

Chester Woodman, a Scotts Bluff county boy living near Morrill, went into the pure-bred swine business and raised two pure-bred Duroc-Jersey pigs. These pigs gained at the rate of 1.2 pounds a piece per day and made their gain at a cost of 4.5 cents per pound. Valuing his pigs at what they are worth as breeding animals, Chester finds that after subtracting the original cost of pigs and the cost of feed fed to them that he made a profit of \$40.10.

Attractive county prizes will be offered this year in Box Butte county for boys making the best records. Besides this, a certificate of achievement will be given by the Agricultural Extension Service of the University of Nebraska to every boy who satisfactorily completes the season's work. These prizes together with the profit on the pigs will make the work very interesting to every boy who enters it. Boys who wish to enter this contest should secure enrollment cards from their teachers or from Mr. Seidel.

Enrollment closes May 1 although feeding the pigs may begin at any time before July 1.

LIVE STOCK PRICES AT SOUTH OMAHA

Cattle Are Fully Steady and Fairly Active

HOGS ACTIVE; HIGHER PRICES

Early Lambs Sales Steady to Strong—Weaker Tendency to Late Trade. Best Western Lambs, \$11.10—Ewes Are Mainly Steady.

Union Stock Yards, South Omaha, Nebr., March 7, 1916.—A very fair run of cattle arrives yesterday, about 8,600 head. Demand was good from all classes of buyers for fat cattle and prices bid and paid were little different from last week's strong close. Strictly good to choice 1,200 to 1,500-pound steers sold at \$8.75 to \$9.10. It was a good steady market for practically everything in the way of cows and heifers and the inquiry was very brisk. Veal calves were quotably firm at \$8.00 to \$10.00, and bulls, stags, etc., found a broad outlet at strong figures. Trade in stockers and feeders was quite active with prices fully steady for all useful offerings.

Cattle quotations: Good to choice steers, \$8.60 to \$9.10; fair to good steers, \$8.25 to \$8.50; common to fair steers, \$7.75 to \$8.25; good to choice heifers, \$8.75 to \$9.75; good to choice cows, \$5.50 to \$7.50; fair to good cows, \$6.00 to \$6.60; canners and cutters, \$4.50 to \$5.75; veal calves, \$7.00 to \$10.00; bulls, stags, etc., \$5.25 to \$6.75; good to choice stockers, \$7.75 to \$8.20; good to choice feeders, \$7.65 to \$8.10; fair to good feeders, \$7.30 to \$7.50; common to fair feeders, \$6.90 to \$7.00; stock heifers, \$6.75 to \$7.75; stock cows, \$6.00 to \$7.25; stock calves, \$7.00 to \$8.50.

Hog receipts yesterday totaled about 9,000 head. The general market was fairly active with values fully steady to in many cases a big five higher. Bulk moved at \$8.60 to \$8.80 and the top reached \$8.95, the highest price paid since August, 1914, and with that one exception as high as anything has sold since July, 1913.

Sheep and lamb receipts amounted to 8,000 head. Early sales of lambs were made at steady to stronger prices and in some cases a little higher, but the late trading was very slow with a weaker tendency to prices. Some good Mexican lambs brought \$11.15, while fed Westerns moved at \$11.10. A bunch of feeding lambs brought \$10.80. Only a few ewes were here and trade was in the main fully steady. The \$8.00 quotation on choice fed Westerns which was in force all last week was canceled up again yesterday.
