USED BY RAILROADS

Transportation Brotherhoods Charge U. S. Chamber of Commerce Is Used Against Them

Cleveland, Ohio, June 7 - That the United States Chamber of Commerce is being used by the railroads as a means of delaying action on the demand for an eight-hour day made by the freight train employes, is charged in a statement issued by the Transportation Brotherhoods.

Immediately after an address by Howard Elliott, president of the financially wrecked New Haven system, made before the United States chamber of commerce at Washington in February, a "committee on the railroad situation" was appointed by the

This committee after deliberating for three months, now proposes that the local chambersy of commerce throughout the United States shall. by vote on the resolutions prepared by the committee, express their opinion as to the introduction in Congress of a joint resolution directing the Interstate Commerce Commission to investigate and report "as soon as possible," the minimum and maximum average wage paid ,with hours of service, etc., to each class of railroad employees in the United States and the relation of railroad wages to railroad revenue and various other complicated and techincal subjects.

The significant part of this transparent scheme for delay is, that both the railroads and the employes are urged to postpone any action on the hours and wage question until the Commission has made its report.

Anyone who is familiar with amount of unfinished work now before the Commission and who knows the necesssarily slow procedure, must admit that two or three years is the lowest estimate of the time required for such an investigation.

The whole proposition of the so called referendum of the United States Chamber of Commerce would appear to be, to postpone any action that would tend to improve the long working hours of railroad freight train employes.

Why there should be any occasion for taking a referendum vote on the question is a mystery, as it is a foregone conclusion that the local chambers of commerce will decide unanimously in favor of the delay and at the end of the time, they will of course just as joyfully vote for some other delay for a succeeding period

It is significant to note that the 'cor mittee on the railroad situa-"tion" arrived at its conclusion that Congressional action was needed without hearing or asking for information from anyone representing the employes. They formulated their report from hearing only one side of he proposition

These tactics remind us of method of railroad attorneys in the courts when an injured workman is bringing suit-any maneuver to de lay the case and wear out the pa tience and capital of the workman, s so much gained for the railroad.

The disastrous affects of hope deferred are all too well known by the railway wage earner to cause him to sympathize with this movement to postpone the receipt by him of his

It is to be hoped that the United States Chamber of Commerce in its investigation by its "committee on he railroad situation" took cognizance of the increase in the salaries paid general officers as compared to the increase in wages of other railway employes.

Taking sixty-two Western railroads as a fair example, the salaries paid general officers in 1900 were \$4,-37,404 and in 1913 \$9,444,528, which is an increase of more than 100 per cent

It should also be observed that the revenue of the railroads in 1890 was \$1.65 per freight train per mile and 1914 the earnings were \$3.31 per freight train per mile, an increase of 100 per cent, which shows the freight train crews are producing double the revenue for the railroads. the general officers are receiving double the salaries and the train crews are doing double the amount of work they had to do a decade ago. with no proportionate increase in
