#### Crop Conditions As Reported By State Board of Agriculture

The Nebraska State Board of Ag- of the board, have been visited by ex-riculture has issued a statement of cellent rains, while other parts are riculture has issued a statement of crop conditions over the state generally. The report shows that the second cutting of alfalfa in Box Butte county will yield on an average a ton to the acre. It is estimated that Box Butte oats will average all the way through about 25 bushels to the acre, with spring wheat at 14 bushels, and winter wheat about 17 bushels. The condition of the corn is placed at about 90 per cent by the board with potatoes at 70. The condition of the hayland is reported good.

There have been a few hail storms reported from the different olcalities, but the reports state they were of a local nature, and the damage was practically confined to the corn crop, as the small grain was practically all harvested.
