NEW DEPOT TO BE BUILT AT SCOTTSBLUFF

Scottsbluff, Neb.—Recent developments regarding the proposed new depot in this city has given the citizens new hopes that the structure will be erected in the immediate future. The contract has been awarded

to Harvey E. Wood, of Aurora, Neb., who has built several large depot buildings for the Burlington road. Mr. McShane, superintendent with headquarters at Sterling, Colo., was in Scottsbluff early this week, and expressed his opinion that there would be but little, if any, delay now, and the parties who now have buildings on the right-of-way where the depot is to be built have been notified to vacate immediately.
