

PLOYMENT OF WOMEN

Summary of Laws Relating to the ployment of Women and Children in Nebraska.

A 9-hour day-No woman shall be week.

Hours between 6 A M. and 10 P. M. The hours of each day may be arranged to permit employment of women at any time between 6 a. m. and 10 p. m. but not between 10 p. m. m. and 6 a.m., execpt in the case consecutive hours.

Seats must be provided for women. Every employer in stores, factories, offices and schools shall provide seats for women in his employ and shall permit the use of the seats.


