PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL

AMENDMENT

A JOINT RESOLUTION to amend Section one (1) of Article seven (7) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. That Section One of Article Seven of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be and the same hereby is amended by striking out the following words:

"Second. Persons of foreign birth who shall have declared their intento the laws of the United States, on the subject of naturalization, at least thirty days prior to an election."

And inserting in the place of the

"Second. Persons of foreign birth who shall have become citizens of the United States by naturalization or otherwise conformably to the laws of the United States at least thirty days forth. prior to an election.

Sec. 2. That at the general elec-(1918) there shall be submitted to the electors of the state for their approval or rejection the foregoing proposed and descriptions. amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage. At such election, on the ballot of each elector voting for or against said proposed coat, trimmed in fur, sometime the words: "For proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage," and "Against said proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage."

> Sec. 3. If such amendment shall be approved by a majorily of all electors voting at such election, said amendment shall constitute Section Approved, April 9, 1918.
