Notice of the Incorporation of the SHERIDAN POTASH COMPANY  
Notice is hereby given that The Sheridan Potash Company has filed its Articles of Incorporation in the office of the County Clerk of Box Butte County, Nebraska, and with the Secretary of State at Lincoln, Nebraska.

The name of this corporation shall be "The Sheridan Potash Company."

The principal place of transacting the business of the corporation shall be in the City of Alliance, Box Butte County, Nebraska.

The purposes for which said corporation is to be formed are as follows:

1. To manufacture, buy, sell, import, export, and in general deal in and with potash, potash salts and all solids contained in alkaline waters. 2. To purchase, hire, lease, or otherwise acquire alkaline lakes, mines, and mineral properties, lands and hereditaments in the State of Nebraska, or elsewhere, on any estate or interest in or right of privilege over, any such lakes, mines or mineral properties, lands, or hereditaments which may be deemed necessary or advisable for the purpose of the company.

3. To work and maintain the lakes, mines and mineral properties and works of the company. To lay pipe lines, erect and construct pumping stations, telephone lines, and electric transmission lines and to carry on and conduct the business of refining the Alkaline waters and all solids contained therein, and selling same and all other minerals in all branches, and to refine and render merchantable all solids contained in the Alkaline waters, and all other minerals to be obtained from the mines or properties of the Company or any Company or person.

4. To take, lease, purchase, and to hold, use, sell, lease, exchange, mortgage, improve, and develop real estate and real property, and any interest or right therein, and to construct or have constructed, houses, buildings, storehouses, refineries, plants and structures of every description, and to buy, sell, own, use, manage, support and lease the same or similar structures.

5. To take, lease, hire, purchase, manufacture or otherwise deal in and with all kinds of machinery, tools, and appliances necessary to carry on said business, handling all kinds of goods, wares, chattels, merchandise and other personal property in connection with carrying on and conducting the business of said corporation.

The amount of Capital Stock of said corporation, shall be Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars, and the amount of capital with which said corporation shall begin is Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00) Dollars. The number of shares of which said corporation is to consist shall be 5,000 shares of the par value of \$10.00 each.

The voting power of said corporation shall be, one vote for each share of capital stock issued by said corporation.

The time of commencement of this corporation shall be the 11th day of September, 1918, and the termination shall be the 11th day of September 1968, and shall have the privilege of renewal of its corporate existence as provided by law.

The highest amount of indebtedness to which the corporation shall at any time subject itself shall not exceed two-thirds of the capital stock.

The corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors, to be elected by its Annual Meeting of each year by a majority vote of the capital stock; and said board of directors is to consist of not less than three, nor more than five members. And said Board of directors shall have the power to adopt by-laws for the government of its meetings, and shall have the power to establish branch offices, manufacturing, and refineries at such places in the United States of America or elsewhere where they may lawfully transact the business of said corporation. Said Board of Directors shall have the power to employ a general manager, agents, and the necessary employees to carry on and conduct its business.

The annual meeting of the stockholders of this corporation shall be held on the first Monday in January of each year, at which meeting the directors of the company shall be elected by a majority vote of the Capital Stock, and such other lawful business done as the stock holders shall deem necessary and proper.

The officers of said corporation shall be a president, vice president, secretary and treasurer, and any party may hold any two of the offices, if the board of directors so

elect. That in the event of the absence of the president, the vice president shall have full power and authority to perform all the duties of the president, and to sign, execute, and deliver any and all instruments, and to do each and every act with full power and authority as the president could perform if present.

The officers shall be chosen by the Board of Directors and shall hold their office for the period of one year and until their successors are elected and qualify, and any vacancies in any office or in the Board of Directors shall be filled by the remaining directors until the successors of the person or persons thus chosen to fill such vacancies are elected by the stock holders at an annual or special meeting, and have duly qualified.

This corporation may be dissolved at any time prior to its own limitations, by consent of two-thirds of the outstanding capital stock of said corporation by a resolution dissolving the corporation spread upon its records and certified to the Secretary of State.

## LIVESTOCK PRICES AT SOUTH OMAHA

Ces' Beeves Steady; Medium Grades 15-25c Lower

HOGS STEADY, CLOSED WEAK

Sheep and Lambs in Very Limited Supply—Demand Good for Both Fat Stock and Feeder Grades at Prices Quotably Steady With the Close of Last Week.

Union Stock Yards, South Omaha, Neb., Nov. 5, 1918.—The week opens out with a rather heavy run of cattle, 16,500 head, and a slow, unevenly lower market. Best grass cattle, as well as corn-fed, about steady, but the general trade on both steers and cows was largely 15@25c lower than last week. Trade in feeders was dull and generally lower.

Hogs Steady to Lower. The run of hogs was fair for a Monday, about 5,000 head, and trade in general was about like it was Saturday, although on late deals prices showed more or less decline. Tops brought \$18.00 and bulk of the trading was at \$17.25@17.65.

A very moderate supply of sheep and lambs showed up for the opening day of the week and for the most part prices were steady with last week's finish. This applied to both fat stock and feeder grades.
