Keep Demand for Good Woolled Lambs and Prices 15c to 25c Higher.—Clipped Lambs Stronger.—Little Aged Stock Offered and Prices Quotably Unchanged.

Union Stock Yards South Omaha, May 6.—Only a moderate Monday's run of cattle showed up, about 5,000 head and the market ruled active and stronger for desirable beeves and butcher stock. Choice 1600 pound beeves brought \$18.35. Rough heavy and plain cattle were slow sale but quotable steady, and there was no particular change in the market for feeders.
