

WILL CONTINUE SALE OF SURPLUS SUPPLIES

List of Articles That May Be Secured From Army Store for This District at Omaha

The government will continue the sale of government surplus food, clothing and other miscellaneous supplies, from two army district stores, on and after September 25, sale to continue until allotment in each district has been sold.

Persons residing in North Dakota, South Dakota and Nebraska will be supplied from Omaha, Neb. Persons residing in Wyoming, Utah and Colorado will be supplied from Denver, Colo. Sales will be made over the counter and individual orders may be sent through the mail and delivery made by parcel post, the government paying all parcel post charges. Present indications are that sales to municipalities will be discontinued. All reclaimed articles will be sold over the counter at army district sales stores. 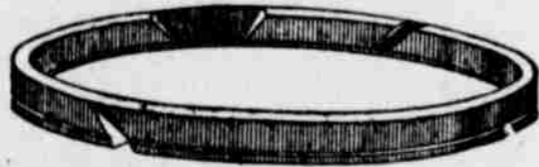
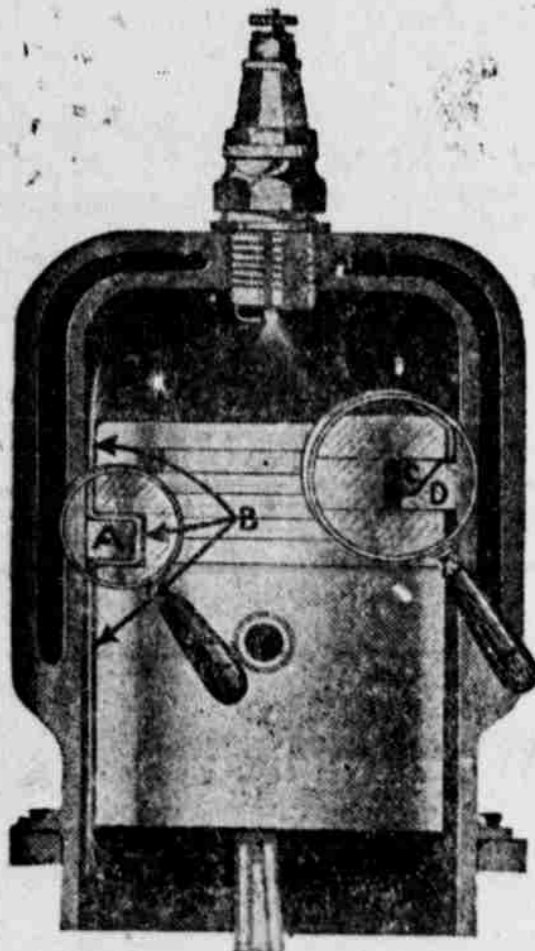
