

The Opera House Block in 1894



HERE is another of the old photographs in the possession of Ted Fielding. It shows the opera house block at it appeared in 1894, one year after it was completed. Notice the sidewalks and the hitching posts, both of which are characteristic of the times, as well as the lamp post and the square sign around it.

Old-timers have been able to recognize most of those appearing in the picture. The man wearing the straw hat at the left of the scene is "Freak" Ellis. The brother next to him, about to start off on a bicy-

cle ride, is not, as one of the boys in the composing room suggested, "Bill" Harper. There are points of resemblance—we'll concede that—but this fellow happens to be Johnny Carmichael, saloonkeep and, some folks say, gambler.

The group of five little boys to the left contains some present Alliance citizens. Ed Reardon is occupying the most prominent post. The one standing with arms akimbo is none other than Ted Fielding, who is now making the 164 Cleaners known in this neck of the woods. Ted doesn't remember the names of

the other boys, but says two of them remind him of Ora Ritter and Bob Driscoll. The man leaning on one arm against the building is Banks Stewart, proprietor of the Alliance Grocery Store, which occupied the left third of the building.

The other two-thirds of the Opera House block was the home of the Chicago store, then owned by Bill Rumer. Mr. Rumer says that the Chicago store had the best looking quarters and was better arranged and decorated as any store of the period and as good as most of them today. E. C. McClure, who died a

few weeks ago in Florida, was the decorator for the establishment, and the inside was fitted with a big archway and a series of mirrors.

Other familiar faces in the photograph are those of George D. Darling, whose head is visible in the center of the diamond-shaped white spot on the door of the Chicago store. His brother is standing in front of him. Leo Perlick and Lee Montgomery are also in the picture. The meat market next door was owned by Tom Wallace.
