Resignation of W. C. Mounts as county clerk is submitted as follows: "To the honorable Board of Commissioners of Box Butte county, Neb. Having been elected on the second day of November, 1920, to the office of Clerk of the District Court in and for Box Butte county, Neb., I therefore respectfully tender my resignation to the office of County Clerk of Box Butte county, Neb., to take effect on the first Thursday after the first Tuesday of January, 1921.

Whereas, Said resignation of the said William C. Mounts has been accepted by the Board of County Commissioners of Box Butte county, Nebraska, and;

Whereas, It is now necessary that the board of commissioners of Box Butte County, Neb., appoint some suitable person as county clerk of Box Butte county, Neb., to fill the unexpired term of the said William C. Mounts; and

Whereas, Avis M. Joder has been deputy county clerk of Box Butte county, Nebraska, and is a suitable and competent person to fill the position of county clerk of Box Butte county, Nebraska; therefore be it
