## BLOTTING PAPER

Blotting paper was an accident. It discovery gained its inventor nothing but a discharge from his position, and first rate scolding to precede that. Early in the 19th century a Berkshire paper manufacturer wandered out into his factory, and glanced into a vat of pulp. The next moment he was raging up and down, and calling curses on the head of a luck ess workman who had forgotten to put in the "sizing." and Phone 664 whose carelessness had ruined batch.

The workman was discharged on the spot, and the "spoilt" batch was thrown aside. Later the manufacturer dec'ded to use it for scratch paper and was still more disgusted, when, on attempting to run his quill across it, found the ink spread in all direc tions and dried in a blur.

As he sat staring at it the idea of "blotting" paper came to him as an inspiration, and it needed but a touch or two to produce a paper similar to that used today. It was made of red rags, and could not be bleached into a better color, and as there were few uses for red paper, the pink or red style remained in force years, and today is still the most popular color in the cheaper grades. The reason it "blots" is that the material is merely a mass of hairlike tubes that suck up the liquid by capillary attraction.—Empeco Paper News.
