A son was born to Mr. and Mrs. Cross of Elworth at the Alliance hospital last Friday.

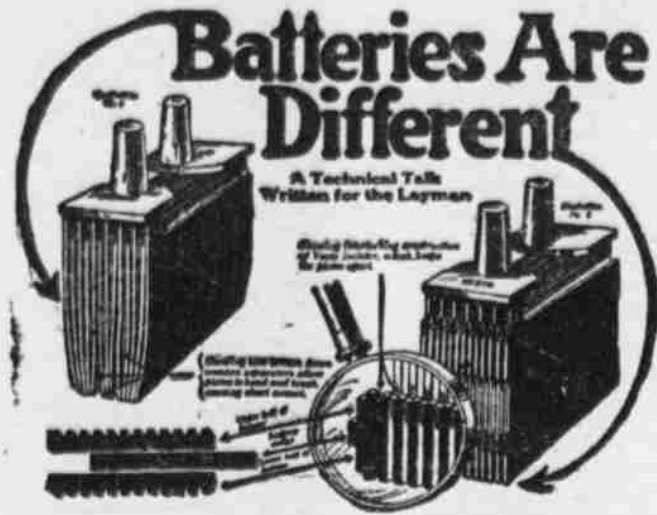
WALTON (TOUGHY) MCCLURE IS IN BAD ONCE MORE
