

LINCOLN, Dec. 10, 1900. There is a general hope that the republican caucus will be held and the senatorial fight disposed of before the 15th of January, the time tor the joint session, in order that necessary legislation may not be retarded.

So far as the state in general is concerned, there is no great demand for legislation at the hands of the coming session. The need of a new revenue law is recognized, but the difficulty of passing one is also recognized. Attempts along this line in the two last sessions failed.

Two years ago the fusionist officials, although all elected or appointed on a plattorm demanding small salaries, came before the legislature and asked for increases. Under their strenuous representations many of the state-house deputies received larger salaries than had eyer before been paid. The incoming republicans will reap the benefit of this example, but no doubt they will be criticised by the fusionists for desiring to keep the salaries at their present figure.


