PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT. The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 3rd, A. D. 1908.

A JOINT RESOLUTION to amend Sections two (2), four (4), five (5), six (6), and thirteen (13) of Article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to Judicial Powers.

Section 1. (Amendment proposed.) That Section two (2) of Article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended to read as follows:

Section 2. (Supreme court, judges, election, term; chief justice.) The judges of the Supreme Court shall be elected by the electors of the state at large; and their term of office shall be six years; and at the general election to be held in the year 1913 and each six years thereafter, there shall be elected three (3) judges of the Supreme Court, who shall hold their office for the period of six years; and at the general election to be held in the year 1913 and each six years thereafter, there shall be elected one (1) judge of the Supreme Court, who shall hold his office for the period of six years.

Section 4. (Amendment proposed.) That Section six (6) of Article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, be amended to read as follows:

Section 5. (Judges, salaries.) That judges of the Supreme Court shall each receive a salary of \$1,500 a year; and the District Court judges shall each receive a salary of \$1,000 per annum, payable quarterly.
