Important Railroad Report.
The report is current in Cheyenne that the Union Pacific will push forward with all possible speed the construction of the North Platte valley branch through to Medicine Bow.

The Cheyenne Tribune, in speaking of the matter says: Kilpatrick Bros. & Collins, the grading contractors, have been ordered to at once concentrate several hundred men and a large number of teams at Oshkosh, Neb.

The men and teams now employed on the Athol-Borie cut-off will, in a short time, be transferred to Oshkosh. It is thought that the graders will complete their work on the cut-off within two weeks.

If this report is true, it means the greatest boost for North Platte the town has ever received; for in the event of the construction of the line North Platte becomes the gateway to the entire North Platte valley; will become the greatest division terminal on the Union Pacific outside of Omaha; the local shops will be trebled in size and the yard system be greatly enlarged. A confirmation of the report will be eagerly awaited by the people of North Platte.
