The Water Situation.
The ten hundred and fifty patrons of the North Platte water company might as well be acquainted with the fact now that this summer there will be no wasting of water. In fact those patrons who have lawns will be thankful to get sufficient water to keep the grass growing instead of allowing the water to run from morning until night—and some times all night. So long as there were 600 or 800 consumers the company placed little if any restrictions on the consumption; but now with 1050 water users the condition is different—it is different because the present plant is inadequate to supply the increased number if the wastefulness of former years is permitted. Hence there will be a change; just what the change will be has not been definitely decided upon by the receiver of the company. Suffice to say, however, that it will be radical. It may be that the order will go forth that lawns can be sprinkled only by holding the hose, that ground sprinklers will not be permitted. That would be a radical change, to be sure, but don't be shocked if such notices is served upon you—and cussing the water company won't help matters one iota. The Tribune is simply warning you to be ready to take your medicine.

The Fire Bag.
Every whaler and sealer that sailed the seas in the days of wooden ships carried a fire bag. This was a tarpaulin bag about a foot long and six inches wide lined with waterproof material, with interlinings of oilcloth and thick flannel. Into this was placed the flint and tinder box for kindling fire, and the bag was then securely fastened with double flaps and tied to keep its contents dry. It was the special duty of the second mate to look after the fire bag and in case of shipwreck to attack it at once to his person by means of stout straps provided for the purpose. Thus if officers and crew were cast away on some deserted shore in the desolate arctic circle the means of obtaining a fire to warm themselves by and to heat food and drink would not be wanting as long as the precious fire bag was safe.
