AN ORDINANCE. Providing for the construction of a Lateral Sewer District to be known as Extension to Sewer District "N" to consist of blocks 94 and 95 of the Original Plat of the City of North Platte, Nebraska...

Section 1: That the lateral sewer district to be known as Extension to Sewer District "N" will be formed from blocks 94 and 95 original plat of the City of North Platte...

Section 2: That the lateral sewer be constructed of 10 in. sewer pipe, at the proper depth, on a grade required by the present sewer system of said city...

Section 3: That the engineer of said city at once prepare and file with the clerk thereof, an estimate of the total cost of said proposed lateral sewer.

Section 4: That after said estimate is made and filed as herein provided, that the clerk of said city at once proceed to advertise in manner and form required by law...

Section 5: If an approved bid be made for said work, that a contract therefor be entered into by the mayor of said city of North Platte, Nebraska, attested by the clerk, with the necessary provisions protecting the interests of said city...

Section 6: To pay for the costs of construction of said lateral sewer flush tanks, man-holes and appliances, a special assessment shall be levied according to the law against the lots abutting upon the line of said lateral sewer...

Section 7: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication. Passed and approved this second day of May, 1911.

Section 8: That a lateral sewer be constructed of 10 in. sewer pipe at the proper depth and on a grade required by the present sewer system of said city, commencing where the center line of the alley of block 1 intersects the main sewer north of said block...
