## MIRACULOUS ESCAPE FROM DEATH BY LIGHTNING

Bert Brunk, of Myrtle precinct, had the most miraculous escape from death by lightning Wednesday evening that could possibly have occurred. He had been planting corn and a severe storm coming up he hitched a team to the buggy and tied a horse on either side of the driving team. He had not driven far when a bolt of lightning descended, struck and killed the four horses, splintered every spoke on the four wheels of the buggy, and splintered part of the back of the seat on which Brunk was sitting. As the horses dropped dead in their traces, the sudden stop of the buggy threw Brunk over the dash board down on the horses, and he sustained a bruised leg by the fall but otherwise he was unharmed. The supposition is that the bolt which struck the horses also ran around the tires of the wheels, thus splintering the spokes, and the current was conducted from the tires to the iron rods on the seat back, yet failed to reach Brunk.

E. R. Goodman, who went out yesterday to pay the insurance loss on the horses, viewed the animals and

the vehicle, and was astounded at the narrow escape.
