Senator Hayward Dead.

United States Senator Monroe L. Hayward died at his home in Nebraska City Tuesday, December 5th, 1899, at 6:20 a. m.

Senator Hayward was first stricken while attending a Modern Woodmen picnic at Brownville in August. He rallied from the attack but never fully regained his health.

Senator Hayward came to Nebraska City in 1867. He soon became one of the foremost citizens of the state, and was highly esteemed for his ability and integrity.

Senator Hayward was born in Willabro, Essex county, New York, Dec. 22nd, 1840. He would have been 59 years of age the 22nd of this month.

Governor Poynter issued the following proclamation:

To the People of the State of Nebraska:

Monroe L. Hayward, senator of United States, died at his home in Nebraska City, Neb., at 6:20 this morning. In him the state has lost one of its most illustrious citizens and faithful servants.

In sorrowful testimony of the loss which has fallen upon our state I direct that on the day of the funeral all flags upon the armies and public buildings of the state, counties, school districts and municipalities will be displayed at half-staff until the day following the funeral.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my seal and caused to be affixed the great seal of Nebraska.

Done at Lincoln this 5th day of December, A. D. 1899.
