Senator Hayward Dead.

United States Senator Monroo L. Hay ward died at his home in Nebraska City Tuesday, December 5th, 1899, at 6:20 a.m. He had been unconscious nearly twentyfour hours and suffered no pain. He leaves a wife, a daughter, Miss Mattie Hayward, and two sons, Major William Hayward and Dr. Edward ilayward. All the members of the family were present when he died except Dr. Hayward, who is a military surgeon in the Philippines.

Senator Hayward was first stricken while attending a Modern Woodmen picare at Brownville in August. He railed from the attack but never fully regained his health. November 9.h he had another attack and never afters ward left his bed. The physicians pronounced the disease progressive paralysis.
