FINANCIAL MATTERS.

The Marine Bank and Grant & Ward Failures.

Failure of the Northwestern Car Company, of Stillwater, Minn.

RELIEF FOR GEN. GRANT.
New York, May 20.—It is reported that Jay Gould and others have started a relief movement for Grant. Conkling was in consultation with Grant today.

VANDERBILT TO THE FORE.
New York, May 10.—A notice that parties who loaned money to the Reading or Jersey Central as collateral can have the loans taken up Monday, is accepted in the board as meaning that Vanderbilt sustains both Reading and Jersey Central.

BANK STATEMENT.
Specie increase, \$2,844,600; circulation decrease, \$227,300; reserve increase \$3,649,450. Banks now hold \$4,455,550 in excess of legal requirements.

U. P. RAILROAD.
New York, May 10.—President Dillon states that the Union Pacific directors will not meet for dividend purposes till June.

EXCITEMENT CONTINUES.
New York, May 10.—A slight renewal of the excitement about Grant & Ward's failure was made this morning. The feeling against Ward does not lessen. Up to noon no new acts transpired. Examiner Scribaw will probably finish the examination of the Marine bank today.

ERIE PAYS.
New York, May 10.—Treasurer Spencer states that the interest on Erie new second mortgages will be paid the first of June, but the bonds raised down to 67½ soon after Spencer's statement.

A STOCK TRICK.
New York, May 10.—Inquiries directed from Chicago reached this city today in regard to the financial condition of Jay Gould. As nothing was heard in New York to excite such inquiries Gould was sought and an explanation requested. Gould said: "This question is not the only one of the kind asked here today. A Wall street news agency yesterday set float an entirely unfounded statement that the Union Pacific would pass the July dividend. This was done as an offset for the purpose to influence Union Pacific stock. It was even among Union Pacific directors this morning, openly announced that on the street there would be an attack on Western Union and Missouri Pacific. In pursuance of this laudable purpose, the information on which your inquiry is based, was telegraphed broadcast over the country. I have received numerous dispatches inquiring into the truth of the statement that I was in financial difficulty. It is needless to say there is not a word of truth in it. The whole purpose of the rumor was to create demoralization in the markets so purchases could be made by heavy buyers at reduced figures. I am inclined to think," said Mr. Gould, with a twinkle of his eye, and glancing at the stocks indicator, "that they were disappointed. Both stocks aimed at are firm, and my information is that the buyers are strong men." An intimate friend of Gould informed the reporter that he (Gould) had recently given substantial aid to many who were crippled by the late troubles in Wall Street, and he had been a large buyer today. He pronounced this financial difficulty a ridiculous invention.

ANOTHER FAILURE.
St. Paul, May 10.—The Northwestern Manufacturing and Car Company, of Stillwater, Minn., of which D. M. Sabin is president, C. D. Gilfen, vice-president, and C. R. Stenson, second vice-president and general manager, failed today. Particulars are yet unobtainable.

St. Paul, May 10.—Director Seymour, former head of the firm of Seymour, Sabin & Co., which was merged into the Northwestern Car company, stated tonight the liabilities of the company were \$1,000,000; assets, \$450,000; that the company was being pressed by a number of creditors on obligations which they had expected to meet on money secured from the east; that the suspension of the Marine bank and the failure of Grant & Ward had so shaken confidence in credits that they had found it impossible to secure the expected advances, and to prevent attachments and the tying up of their property the

company has resolved to have a receiver appointed, expecting to discharge all their obligations, and after the temporary embarrassment to resume business as a corporation. It is understood that A. H. Brown, of Herzog, Bean & Brown, of Stillwater, has been selected as receiver of the Northwestern Car company. The company had a great basket in the Stillwater penitentiary fire of last winter. For some time past the stock has been offered freely in large quantities.

Later reports confirm the appointment of Brown as receiver. Commodore N. W. Kitson, also a director, when seen tonight said the company's affairs had been well managed. The assets, he thought, would more than three times pay the liabilities. The paid up capital was \$3,000,000.

A BOSTON FIRM.
Boston, May 10.—B. S. Snow & Co., wholesale fish dealers, failed. They were embarrassed in February last, but made arrangements with their creditors without publicity. The second payment under that arrangement is now due, and being unable to meet it they have assigned. The liabilities are from \$150,000 to \$200,000.

THE MARINE BAND.
Examiner Scribaw has worked all day in the Marine bank. In the afternoon he set for Ferd and Ward, of the firm of Grant & Ward. Ward walked down Wall street, followed by two men, said to be detectives, and had three-quarters of an hour interview with Scribaw, after which he returned to his office. Scribaw said his report would not be ready until Monday, that he would send it to the comptroller of the currency at Washington.
