1st. The system of custom duties which has been adopted by the government since its foundation, is approved.
2d. The fostering of industries rough and by this system is approved.
3d. A change from the present system, to one even thought to be better, would be dangerous.
4th. A reasonable concession in du-

ties can be had without danger to labor interests.
This being about all the protectionists required, Billy, Frothy Morrison was made chairman and ordered to report the plank, when complete, to the convention. Thus ends one of the most insignificant farces the country has witnessed in its political history. This plank should be reported by Mr. Morrison, as the tariff for office only plank.
Now it is in order for our Free Trade cranks who have been preaching a millennium on this revenue question, to date from the Chicago convention, to come to the front, one at a time gentlemen.

Democrats who imagine, that the charges made by the Republican party against the present democratic party, of which the New York Herald, World, Times and Post, are the authorized organs, are groundless, have only to read the tone of the English press to know the truth. That these organs represent English sentiment there can be no doubt.
