**PROCLAMATION.**  
 WHEREAS, a joint resolution was adopted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, at the Eighteenth Session thereof, and approved February 27th, A. D. 1883, proposing an Amendment to Section Four (4), Article Three (3), of the Constitution of said State, and that said section as amended shall read as follows, to-wit:  
 "Section 4.—The term of office of members of the Legislature shall be two years, and they shall each receive a salary of three hundred dollars for their services during said term, and ten cents for every mile they shall travel in going and returning from the place of meeting of the Legislature, on the most usual route. *Provided, however,* that neither members of the Legislature nor employees nor receive any pay or perquisites other than their salary and mileage. Each session, except special sessions, shall be not less than sixty days. After the expiration of forty days of the session no bills or joint resolutions of the nature of bills shall be introduced, unless the Governor shall, by special message, call the attention of the Legislature to the necessity of passing a law on the subject matter embraced in the message, and the introduction of bills shall be restricted thereto."  
 The ballots at the election at which said Amendment shall be submitted shall be in the following form: "For proposed Amendment to the Constitution relating to Legislative Department." "Against proposed Amendment to the Constitution relating to Legislative Department."  
 WHEREAS, a joint resolution was adopted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska at the Eighteenth session thereof, and approved February 27th, A. D. 1883, proposing an amendment to Section One (1) of Article Five (5) of the constitution of said State, and that said section as amended shall read as follows, to-wit:  
 "Section 1.—The Executive Department shall consist of a Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of Public Accounts, Treasurer, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Attorney General, Commissioner of Public Lands and Buildings, and Board of Railway Commissioners. The officers named in this section shall each hold his office for the term of two years from the first Thursday after the first Tuesday in January next after his election and until his successor is elected and qualified. *Provided, however,* that the election of said officers shall be held on the first Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November, 1888, and each succeeding election shall be held at the same relative time in each even year thereafter. All other officers that may be provided for by law under the provisions of this section, shall be chosen in such manner and at such times, and shall have their offices for such length of time as may be provided by law, and shall perform such duties and receive such compensation as may be provided for by law. The Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of Public Accounts, Treasurer, Commissioner of Public Lands and Buildings, and Attorney General, shall reside at the seat of government during their terms of office, and keep the public records, books and papers there, and the officers herein named shall perform such duties as may be required by law."  
 The ballots at the election at which said Amendment shall be submitted shall be in the following form: "For proposed Amendment to Section One (1) of Article Five (5) of the Constitution, entitled 'Executive Department.'" "Against proposed Amendment to Section One (1) of Article Five (5) of the Constitution, entitled 'Executive Department.'" Therefore, James W. Dawes, Governor of the State of Nebraska, do hereby give notice, in accordance with Section One (1) Article Fifteen (15) of the Constitution, and the provisions of an act entitled "An Act to provide the manner of proposing Amendments to the Constitution and submitting the same to the Electors of this State," approved February 15th, A. D. 1877, that said proposed Amendments will be submitted to the qualified voters of this State for ratification or rejection at the General Election to be held on the 4th day of November, A. D. 1884.
