"It is a fact that Powers is making a strong fight for the gubernatorial candidacy. He is certainly working hard to get the nomination and has a good ally in Jay Burrows. They are making a thorough canvass of the state on the quiet and will certainly present a formidable front to the Van Wyck faction."
