

POOR FARM CONTRACT LET

A. L. TODD BEING THE LOWEST BIDDER AND GETS THE CONTRACT.

Commissioners Also Let the Contract For Painting the Ceiling and Basement of the Court House.

The county commissioners are in monthly session, and have transacted considerable business already.

The poor farm contract was let to A. L. Todd, he being the lowest bidder. There were three bidders—Todd at \$650, R. F. Dean at \$780, and Elmer Eikenbary at \$600. Todd's bid being \$10 lower than Eikenbary's was the one accepted.

The contract for burying paupers was let to Stroight & Sattler. That firm and J. L. Urub both put in bids that were identical. They drew lots to see who should have the plum, and it fell to Stroight & Sattler.

County physicians were appointed in the different districts as follows: first district, Dr. E. D. Cummins; third district, Dr. M. M. Butler; fourth district, Dr. J. A. Hassmeier; fifth district, Dr. J. M. Nealey; sixth district, J. B. Tamblin. The bids from the second district were all rejected.

The voting place in Greenwood precinct was changed from section 15 to the town of Alvo.

This afternoon the commissioners decided to have the walls and ceiling of the basement and the upper floor of the court house painted, and awarded the contract to Louis Ottmar for \$700. This is a durable and much needed improvement that will preserve and beautify the walls of the court house for an indefinite period. One of the advantages of the oil finish is that it can be washed whenever necessary.
