## Funeral Of Mrs. Joslin

Impressive Ceremonies Mark the Passing of a Lovely Character.

Mrs. B. B. Joslin departed this life at the home of her parents, Dr. and Mrs. A. A. Randall, in this city Saturday, June 12, 1929.  
The deceased had been suffering from a lingering illness for several months, and though extremely weak at the approach of death was conscious until almost the last.  
Miss Ina Maie Randall was born at Nelson, Neb., on Nov. 25, 1887, and was a consistent member of the M. E. church, which she joined under the ministry of her father, pastor of the church in this city, in 1903. She was a faithful worker in church circles, being a teacher in the Sunday school, a singer in the choir and a member of the Epworth League. Among many other accomplishments, she possessed a cultured voice, and a kindly disposition, being highly esteemed and loved by all who knew her.  
She was united in marriage at the home of her parents in this city, to Mr. B.
