

**Commissioners' Proceedings.**

Plattsmouth, Neb. August 24, 1909.

Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment, with all members present. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved, whereupon the following business was transacted in regular form:

Printing of delinquent tax list was awarded the Elmwood Leader Echo.

County Treasurer instructed to cancel certificate of Tax Sale, No. 827, on lots 6 and 7, block 62, Weeping Water City, for the year 1904, account of error should have been cancelled by tax sale No. 1054.

A strip of land was purchased and deed given by Mark Iles and wife to Cass county for road purposes, consideration \$30.00.

A petition from patrons from school district No. 24, through their attorney, M. Gering, was presented, asking that the county board's action taken on Oct. 20, 1908, with reference to change of school district boundary lines be rescinded and set aside and that said school district No. 24 be heard and a time and place set for a hearing upon the petition filed by the board of education of Elmwood, Neb., upon the 29th day of June 1908, and the same was this day refused by a unanimous vote of the board.
