

Delinquent Tax List.

In Cass county, Nebraska, for the year 1904. Notice is hereby given that I, William D. Wheeler, Treasurer of the County of Cass, in the State of Nebraska, will on the first Monday in November, being the sixth day of November, 1905, as required by law, commence selling at the office of the county treasurer of said county, in the City of Plattsmouth, at public auction, so much of the following tracts of lands and town lots as shall be necessary to pay the taxes, together with interest and costs that may be accrued thereon for the year 1904, as appears from tax list of said year. Said sale will be held between the hours of 9 o'clock a. m. and 4 o'clock p. m. of said date, and continue from day to day between said hours until all of said property, upon which delinquent taxes remain unpaid, shall be sold or offered for sale. I shall also offer for sale at same time and place all certificates of tax sale of the County of Cass and City of Plattsmouth acquired under tax suits which are undeposited at time of said sale.

TAX JUDGMENT SALE.

Pursuant to decrees of the District Court of Cass County, Nebraska, duly entered in the state tax suit for the year 1904 or former years, in behalf of the State of Nebraska to enforce the payment of delinquent taxes and assessments upon real estate by the State of Nebraska, and in pursuance of the statutes in such cases made and provided, I shall on Wednesday, the 6th day of November, A. D. 1905, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, at the office of the County Treasurer, in the City of Plattsmouth and the County of Cass, offer for sale to the highest bidder for cash the lands and lots on which decrees of said court have been entered, as shown by published list herewith, to satisfy the amount of such decrees with interest, penalties and costs, such sale will continue from day to day from nine o'clock a. m. to five o'clock p. m. until all the lands therein described have been sold or offered twice. I shall also offer for sale at the same time and place all certificates of tax sale of the County of Cass acquired under state tax suits which are undeposited at time of said sale.

COURT HOLDS ACT INVALID

Register of Deeds Law Declared Unconstitutional.

The new law extending the term of registers of deeds one year was declared invalid and unconstitutional by the Supreme court yesterday evening, Judge Barnes dissenting, says the Lincoln Journal. As a result the old law is in force and the names of candidates for registers of deeds will have to be placed on the ballot by county clerks. The court gave only an oral opinion and will file a written opinion later.

One cause for haste in the matter was the general desire of county clerks to ascertain the opinion of the court in time to prepare the ballots. The decision was given in the Gage county and the Buffalo county mandamus suits to compel the county clerk to place the names of candidates on the ballot. The suits involving the right to extend the terms of county supervisors were not decided. These suits were argued and submitted to the court late in the evening and as they involved questions somewhat different from those in the register of deeds cases they will not be decided until today. In dissenting from the opinion of the court that the register of deeds act is unconstitutional, Judge Barnes holds that the legislature has power to extend the term of an office which it can create and abolish at pleasure. In the general biennial election law, recently declared unconstitutional, constitutional officers were involved.

To the Voters of Cass County.

Having learned that the statement is being circulated that, as sheriff of the county, I neither arrested or captured Max Ploehn, the assassin of Miss Alma Goos, I beg to submit the following sworn affidavit, the original of which may be seen and read by any person at the First National Bank of Plattsmouth. I have no desire to exploit my own conduct while a public servant, but in justice to myself and friends I feel warranted in this manner to refute such erroneous statements:

To Whom It May Concern:

STATE OF NEBRASKA, ss County of Lancaster, ss I, Max Ploehn, of Lancaster, Nebraska, being first solemnly sworn, do hereby certify and say that I am the identical person who was charged with the offense of killing Miss Alma Goos, of Cass county, Nebraska, on the 10th day of June, 1905, and that I pleaded guilty to said charge, and was sentenced to the state penitentiary of Nebraska, for the period of my natural life, where I am now incarcerated.

That I was captured and arrested on the 15th day of June, 1905, in the hay loft of the barn belonging to Mrs. Anna Goos, by John D. McBride, Sheriff of Cass county, Nebraska, which said barn was and is now occupied by Peter Mumm, and that no other person or persons assisted the said McBride in arresting or disarming me. That after my arrest, said McBride and myself left the barn, and while in the custody of said sheriff, I saw at the south end of said barn, John Cory, August Bein and Peter Mumm, and that neither of said persons were present at the time of my arrest, and further affirm sayeth not.
