
SIXTEEN OF THEM PASSENGERS

Detroit, Nov. 28 .- A Free Press special from Wiarton, Ont., says: The coasting steamer J. H. Jones, owned by the Crawford Tug company, a local concern, foundered off Cape Cocker, last Thursday afternoon, and all hands were lost. The crew consisted of twelve, all from Wiarton, and the number of passengers is estimated at sisteen. 
