NUMBER OF RAILROAD ACCIDENTS IN COUNTY

From Friday's Daily.

The following figures in regard to the fatalities and injuries on railroads will be interesting to the readers of the Journal, as it shows the appalling number of accidents which occur. In the matter of fatal accidents the Burlington is more fortunate than most of the roads, as their percentage of fatalities is very low:

Defective roadway and defective equipment, jointly, caused more than 70 per cent of all the derailments of steam railroads of the United States during the quarter ended March 31, last, according to statistics announced today by the Interstate Commerce Commission. Of derailments due to defective roadway, more than 20 per cent were caused by broken rails.

During the quarter 158 persons were killed and 3,625 were injured in train accidents. These figures showing a decrease of 169 killed and 1,152 injured, as compared with those for the corresponding period of 1912.

In other train accidents, including accidents to employees while at work, to passengers getting on and off cars, and to passengers, 2,086 persons were killed and 17,193 injured, showing a decrease of 30 killed and increase of 1,480 injured.

By industrial accidents, not occurring in train operations, but occurring to railway employees on railway premises, 97 were killed and 26,812 injured, a decrease of one killed and an increase of 8,836 injured.

The total shows a decrease of 150 killed and an increase of 1,159 injured, as compared with the corresponding quarter of last year.

Hand Badly Injured.

This morning about 11:30 Ben Brooks, while trying to start the gasoline engine that operates the concrete mixer for McMaken & Son, received an injury to his hand that will incapacitate him for work for some time. As Mr. Brooks was starting the engine the crank slipped, with the result that the middle finger of his right hand was ripped to the bone, the flesh being almost completely torn off. The injured man was hurried to the office of a physician, where the injured member was dressed and made as comfortable as possible under the circumstances.

COMPLAINT ABOUT THE HOWLING OF THE DOGS

One of our friends in this city, whose rest at night has been disturbed by the howling of various canines around his premises, has handed us the following timely article on that subject that appeared in a recent issue of the World-Herald, and while our peaceful slumbers have not been bothered by the dogs, still we feel a warm sympathy for those citizens whose places are visited at night by the troops of dogs that infest the streets of this city.

Every few days the papers report that someone has been haled into the police court for keeping a dog that disturbs the whole neighborhood by barking for hours at night. It appears very strange that the owner of a dog and none of his family is ever disturbed by the barking, although it is impossible for anybody to sleep without range of the howls. Sometimes it is because the owner shuts the dog up in the house and goes away to the theater or on a visit, staying until midnight, in which case no one near can get any sleep until the owner comes home.

Last week one man of somewhat nervous disposition, came home tired out with the day's business, and the dog shut in the next house howled continuously until 11:30, when the man and his wife arose, went down town and staid at a hotel for the remainder of the night.

On a block where several dogs are kept, if one begins to howl, it is only a minute or two before all the rest join in, and then there is a general roar for some time. There should surely be some way of stopping this nuisance aside from appearing in a police court and making a disagreeable enemy of a neighbor. There is certainly a remedy needed.
