PURCHASES THE A. O. U. W. HALL

New Order of Knights of Columbus
to Be Housed in Building on
Chicago Avenue.

The local council of the Knights of Columbus, which was organized only a short time ago has grown to such membership as to make necessary the securing of a building that could satisfactorily house the order and accordingly the council is concluding the negotiations which will give them the ownership of the hall on Chicago avenue owned by the A. O. U. W. lodge of this city. This hall is particularly adapted to the use of the order as it is provided with a large assembly hall and ante rooms on the second floor while the first floor is equipped for a banquet hall and for social gatherings. The Knights of Columbus which has a large and active membership in the council in this city is constantly growing and now ranks among the largest fraternal orders in the city.

The local order has been meeting in the St. John's school building but this arrangement was far from satisfactory and in order to have a more suitable home it was decided to make the purchase of the A. O. U. W. building which is well located and easy of access from all sections of the city. It is expected that the formal transfer of the property will be made next week and the new order assume the control of the building and remove their lodge property to its new home.

Since its foundation the Knights of Columbus has grown into the greatest Catholic order in the world and while its membership is limited to those of the Roman Catholic faith, its work for good has not been confined to this sect alone. During the war with Germany the Knights of Columbus performed a great service in their work with the American Expeditionary forces in France and Germany and their representatives abroad were constantly on the go in looking after the welfare of the soldiers regardless of their religious belief. CHANGE IN TIME AT SHOPS.

Commencing this morning the freight car repair department of the Burlington shops enters upon a nine-hour schedule for working owing to the large amount of business. The men will commence work at 7:30 a.m. and quit at 5:30 instead of at 8 and 5 o'clock as they have been during the past few months.

The employees of the upholstery department of the shops have been having considerable difficulty in the last few days in getting the question of the women workers settled satisfactorily and as a result of the condition of things a number of the men employed there have laid off from work until the question is settled. It seems that the women employed as helpers are receiving wages equal to that of the skilled mechanics who have spent several years in learning their trade and this is not at all satisfactory to the mechanics and as a result number have laid off in protest to the employment of the women under the present wage scale.
