POSTOFFICE AT MURRAY IS BURGLARIZED

SAFE BELONGING TO GOVERNMENT BLOWN OPEN AND CONTENTS RIFLED.

The village of Murray is apparently becoming one of the targets for the gangs of robbers that have been operating in eastern Nebraska, and the United States postoffice at that place is the latest building to be visited by the unwelcome night callers.

Yesterday morning when Postmaster W. S. Smith came down to his place of business he was surprised to find that the store had been entered and the safe in which the postal supplies was kept had been blown open and the contents strewn over the interior of the store. Fortunately there had been no cash in the safe and as far as could be estimated this morning the loss will be in the neighborhood of \$50 worth of stamps. Mr. Smith, however, suffered quite a loss personally as the visitors carried away with them all of his private papers, such as insurance policies, deeds, abstracts and receipts that were kept in the safe.

Entrance to the store was gained by forcing open one of the windows at the front of the building, after which the robbers apparently made themselves at home, opening all the doors so as to afford an easy way of escape in case a hurried exit became necessary.

The safe had been blown open by the use of "soup," the robbers evidently having had experience at such jobs, for the Murray case was very complete in its workings.

There were no clues at the store that might aid in the identification of the robbers and the only fact that might have a bearing on the case was discovered by Sheriff Quinton, when it was learned that about 3 o'clock Sunday morning some of the residents of Murray had heard a car going west at a very high rate of speed and it is thought possible that this may have been the robbers.

The blowing of the safe was apparently heard by no one in town, as no report has been made of any-

one hearing an explosion during the night.

Saturday night the store of Bowman & Holmes, at Otos, five miles south of Avoca, was burglarized and a large number of watches and other articles taken and it is thought that possibly the same gang of auto bandits had come to Murray and pulled off the job at the postoffice.

The inspector of the postoffice department is at Murray today investigating the robbery and checking up the office to fully ascertain the amount of the loss.

HASTINGS C. C. TO ATTEND RATE CASE

Hastings, Neb., Oct. 12.—The board of directors of the Hastings Chamber of Commerce today instructed the traffic committee of which G. J. Olson is chairman to attend the hearing before the state railway commission at Lincoln, October 25, on the petition of the railway carriers for permission to increase freight rates the balance of the authorized 35 per cent.

Local shippers do not oppose the increase but they say the carriers have not acted according to the agreement of August 3 to make adjustments in the rates that will put inland town freight rates on a parity with Missouri river towns.

Unless this adjustment is made the shippers say they will oppose the granting of the permission to increase by the commission.
